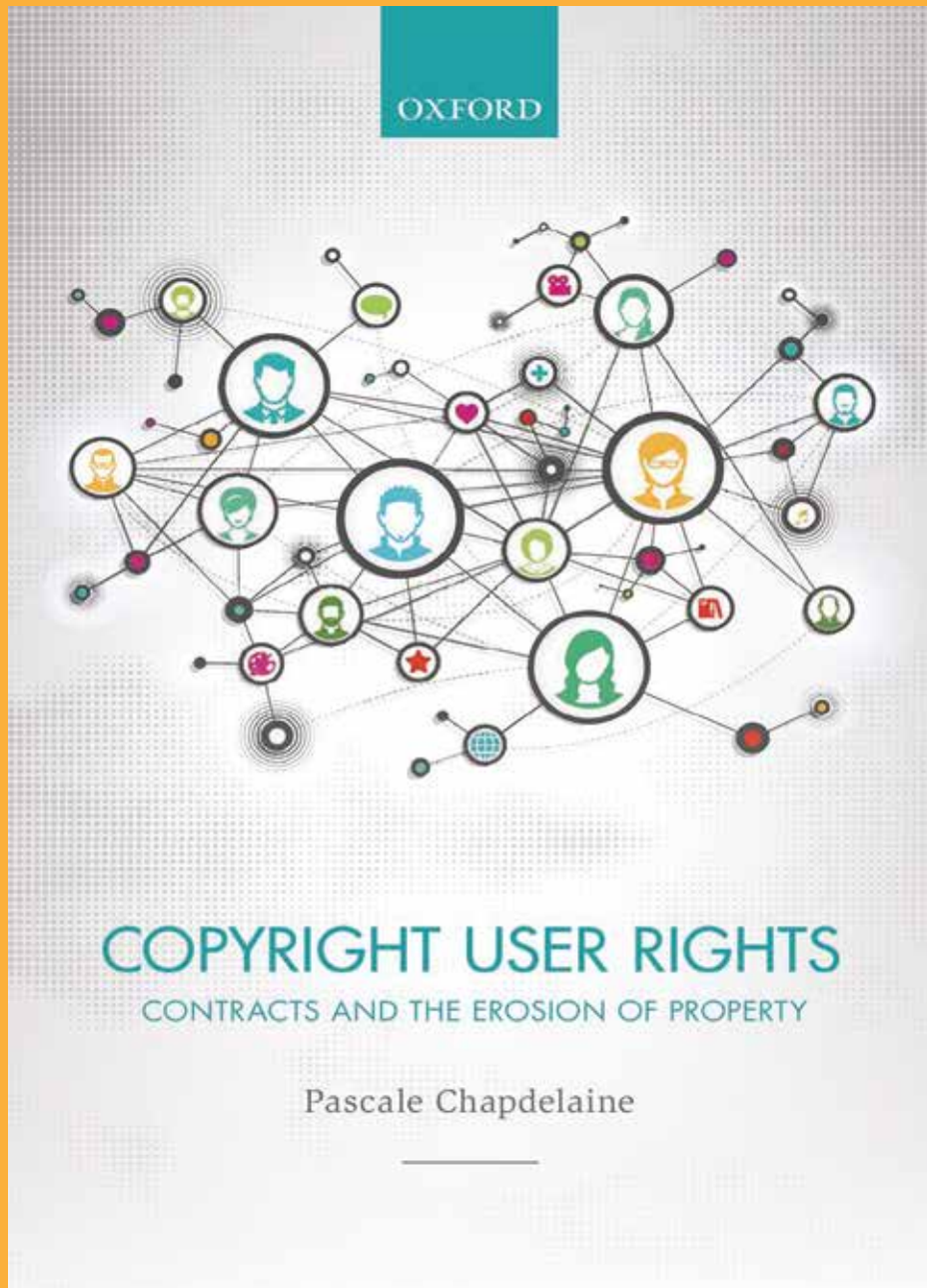

As the Supreme Court of Canada reminded us on several occasions, if copyright holders have rights, so do users. Dr. Pascale Chapdelaine

Pascale Chapdelaine is Associate Professor at the University of Windsor, Faculty of Law. Her research looks at the interaction between intellectual property, property and contracts, as well as to how new technologies and automated business processes shape consumers' rights and expectations. Prior to joining the Faculty of Law in 2014, Prof. Chapdelaine practised law for over fourteen years as Vice-President, and legal counsel at Bell Canada and BCE Inc. in intellectual property and commercial law, and as associate at the Montreal-based law firm Lavery de Billy in corporate, commercial and securities law.

Prof. Chapdelaine holds an LL.B. & B.C.L. from McGill University, Faculty of Law, an LL.M. from the K.U. Leuven Faculty of Law (Belgium) and a Ph.D. from Osgoode Hall Law School. She is called to the Bar of Ontario and le Barreau du Québec.
