5) Nov. 3, 2017 – Brainstorming Lunch & Learn: Roxana Olivera, Osgoode Journalist in Residence “A Girl’s Right to Be Forgotten”

Nearly eight decades ago, news travelled around the world that a *five*-year-old girl in Latin America was pregnant. Journalists travelled long distances to see her at the hospital where she was to give birth. Since then, journalists have written about her as if she were a mere object of curiosity, turning her tragedy into a sensational news story. In the process, they have invaded her privacy, robbed her of her childhood and stripped her of her human dignity.

Today, her story, name and photographs circulate widely on the internet. Images of her naked body when she was seven months pregnant – taken, without her prior and informed consent, in an era in which there was no internet – currently appear on Wikipedia, Facebook, YouTube and a long list of on-line publications. Wikipedia, for its part, refuses to take them down.

The case in question raises concerns over issues of child victimization and internet-related exploitation, along with issues of ethics, privacy, tort law, medical law, intellectual property law and corporate social responsibility.
